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My first participation in Sefer youth conference happened in 2004, and I would never forget the feeling from communication with the scientific community, where my ideas were met with interest – it was such stimulation to all followed researches. So my science “socialisation” happened just because of Sefer.

In 2007 I was invited to teach at the Sefer summer school – I consider that as one of most important landmark in my “scientific” biography. To sum up the role of Sefer in my life, the most important fact would be a quite provocative push toward scientific growth, but this push was given in a remarkably gentle and pleasant way. In just three years I transformed from a student to a teacher! In December 2009 I defended my PhD thesis, and the fact itself, that my topic belonged to Jewish Studies – is a great merit of Sefer, which all these years supported my interest giving me the brilliant opportunities to improvement!
